[Salvage and disaster recovery](#)

Historic England runs a practical 3 day course in disaster recovery. The course, which has a contribution from West Midlands Fire Service teaches how an effective response during an emergency incident can mitigate loss and damage to heritage assets. This course provides hands-on experience of removing objects from an incident location and following appropriate first-aid treatment. The course is particularly relevant for major churches and cathedrals and those with significant heritage assets.
