WELCOME

Pastoral Workers, Readers and Lay Pioneer are theologically trained and authorised lay people. Our Readers and Pastoral Workers have done Foundations for Ministry together followed by two further years of training relevant to their different callings. Our Lay Pioneers have trained with the Church Mission Society. The ministries of these three groups are different, but complementary; all are rich blessings to the life and mission of the Church.

Readers lead worship, preach and make connections between faith and everyday life. They work to pioneer new opportunities for mission, bring God into conversation and teach the faith. Some take Communion to the sick and do other pastoral work. As informed lay people Readers are not only a skilled resource for the Church, but they also bring the fruits of their training and experience as Readers into their communities and workplaces where they live out their faith and witness to Christ.

WELCOME

Pastoral Workers visit those who are ill and take Holy Communion to the housebound. They support the bereaved and prepare people for marriage and baptism. They run craft groups, lunch clubs, prayer meetings and home groups and do much more besides. They also lead teams and support and enable others who work in pastoral ministry. Pastoral Workers offer their skills within the Church and outside it, partly through the many contacts the Church makes with people at significant times in their lives, and partly through simply being out and about and known within their communities and workplaces.

WELCOME

Lay Pioneer Ministers are innovators who seek to start new missional projects to facilitate evangelism and discipleship. They aim to follow the example of Jesus in a ministry of relationship building with groups and individuals within a local community so that they can create opportunities for those on the fringes of the Church to journey together to explore questions of life and faith. Pioneer ministry has a broad spectrum of practice and can take place within, alongside or outside traditional church structures. At its very heart pioneer ministry is about seeking to share the love of Christ with those who do not yet know Him.

Bishop Mark introduces the service Bishops Sam and Julie then continues

We gather with joy to celebrate the ministries of those who are to be licenced as Pastoral Workers, Readers and Lay Pioneer, and continue to support those who are moving to serve in a new parish.

Pastoral Workers are called to work in partnership with the clergy and others in caring for people both within and beyond the family of the Church. In the Gospel, Jesus tells us that what we do for the least of our brothers and sisters, we do also for him; and that it is by our love for one another that others will know that we are his disciples.

Those who are to be admitted as Pastoral Workers today will serve their communities in a variety of ways: preparing families for baptism and couples for marriage and supporting them in the years that follow, visiting the sick and housebound; comforting the bereaved and lonely. By God's grace they will proclaim the Good News of Christ's kingdom by the generosity of their care and the integrity of their lives.

THE WELCOME

Readers are called to serve the Church of God and to work together with clergy and other ministers. They are to lead public worship, to preach and teach the word of God, to assist at the Eucharist and to share in pastoral and evangelistic work. As authorised lay ministers, they are to encourage the ministries of God's people, as the Spirit distributes gifts among us all. They are called to help the whole Church to participate in God's mission to the world.

Lay Pioneers are called to work with others to reach out to people who have traditionally been outside the orbit of the Church. They are called to share the love of Christ by developing a wide variety of creative and innovative approaches to mission and developing them through to fruition. That might include using a shared or common interest or hobby to form small-group missional communities or inquirers groups. By their gifts of imagination and creativity they spread the good news of Jesus out to the world.

For thus says the Lord of hosts: Just as I purposed to bring disaster upon you, when your ancestors provoked me to wrath, and I did not relent, says the Lord of hosts, so again I have purposed in these days to do good to Jerusalem and to the house of Judah; do not be afraid. These are the things that you shall do: Speak the truth to one another, render in your gates judgements that are true and make for peace, do not devise evil in your hearts against one another, and love no false oath; for all these are things that I hate, says the Lord.

THE NEW TESTAMENT

A reading from the Gospel according to John, chapter 20 beginning to read at the 19th verse.

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the lews, lesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them. "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with

them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them. "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side. I will not believe." A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." Now lesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

Have they also made the declaration of obedience to the Bishop and the declaration which must be made before a Reader is licensed?

She replies

They have.

Canon Vivien then says

Bishop Mark, I present to you this candidate to be admitted as a Pastoral Worker.

Bishop Mark responds

Vivien - has she made the Declaration of Assent, and thereby affirmed and declared her belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness? Have she also made the declaration of obedience to the Bishop?

She replied

She has.

Canon Vivien then says

Bishop Mark, I present to you these candidates to be admitted as Lay Pioneers.

Bishop Mark responds

Vivien - have they made the Declaration of Assent, and thereby affirmed and declared their belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness? Have they also made the declaration of obedience to the Bishop?

She replies

They have.

All the candidates turn to face Bishop Mark; he asks the Directors of Studies, the following to which they respond

Liz and Jenny, are these men and women of Christian character, well versed in the Holy Scriptures and in the doctrines of our faith?

They reply

They are.

Bishop Mark continues

Have they been sufficiently prepared for the duties of this office?

They reply

They have.

Bishop Mark turns to the candidates and says

In order that we may be satisfied that you are ready to begin the ministry of a Reader, Pastoral Worker or Lay Pioneer, you must answer the questions we put to you.

Do you believe that God is calling you to this ministry?

I do so believe.

Will you be faithful in leading the people of God in worship, and in preaching the Word to them?

By the grace of God, I will.

Will you be diligent in prayer, in reading Holy Scripture, and in all studies that will deepen your faith and fit you to bear witness to the truth of the gospel?

By the grace of God, I will.

Will you endeavour to fashion your life according to the way of Christ?

By the grace of God, I will.

Will you promote unity, peace and love in the Church and in the world and especially among those whom you serve?

By the grace of God, I will.

Will you work closely with your colleagues in ministry and encourage the gifts of others?

By the grace of God, I will.

The candidates turn to face the congregation, who respond to the Bishop's questions

Brothers and sisters, these men and women have been chosen for the offices of Reader, Pastoral Worker or Lay Pioneer. Will you uphold and encourage them in their ministry?

We will.

Will you continue to pray for them? **We will.**

Bishop Mark invites the Incumbents of the new Pioneer Ministers, Pastoral Workers and Readers' parishes to stand and asks them

Will you work closely with your colleagues and encourage them to use their gifts and develop their ministry?

We will.

Will you commend them to the people amongst whom they will minister?

We will.

The candidates and incumbents then sit

Bishop Mark says:

God our Father, Lord of all the world, we thank you that through your Son you have called us into the fellowship of your universal Church. Hear our prayer for your faithful people that in their vocation and ministry, each may be an instrument of your love, and give to your servants, now to be admitted to the office of Reader, Pastoral Worker and Lay Pioneer Minister, the needful gifts of grace. Grant them wisdom and understanding in their reading and proclamation of your holy word and keep them in all holiness, through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

Canon Vivien calls, by name, each candidate in turn.

The candidate then kneels before Bishop Mark saying:

N, I admit you as a Pastoral Worker/Reader/Lay Pioneer in the Church, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Take authority to exercise the office of Pastoral Worker/Reader/Pioneer Minister in this Diocese. Receive this licence as your authority to serve and may God richly bless you and his world in your ministry. **Amen.**

Each Reader receives a Bible and their incumbent places a scarf on them.

The Pastoral Worker receives a pastoral edition of the New Testament and her incumbent gives her, her badge.

Each Lay Pioneer receives a pastoral edition of the New Testament

Bishop Mark will hand the Licence to those Readers and Pastoral Workers who are moving to a new parish and says:

N, take authority to exercise the office of Reader/Pastoral Worker/Lay Pioneer in this Diocese.

Bishop Mark will hand the Licence to those Readers/Pastoral Workers who have moved from another diocese with these words:

Welcome to our fellowship. N, take authority to exercise the office of Reader/Pastoral Worker in this Diocese.

After returning to their seats the newly licensed Readers/Pastoral Workers and Lay Pioneers then turn to face the congregation and Bishop Mark says the following to which the congregation respond:

I present to you your newly licensed Readers, Pastoral Workers and Lay Pioneers.

We welcome you.

Applause is given – all then stand
