The children worked in Kagan teams to act out their favourite good news parable and talked about what the parable taught them.

To fully reach the expected and exceeding target teachers will need to alter their teaching and subsequent assessment task by....

- Ensuring children understand the meaning of the parable at their level
- Asking children to show how & why the parable is important to Christians
- Giving an opportunity for the children to talk about how the parable helps Christians live today eg in hard times
- Make a link with Christian values
- Ask themselves if their teaching helped pupils meet the learning objectives. and deepened pupils understanding of the story
- Ask themselves if their marking moved the learning on each time & if children were given opportunity to respond
- Set assessment tasks that give an opportunity for pupils to show deepened understanding eg by scaffolding answers using sentence starters
