#### The Journey: our new Weekend Youth Residential!

A weekend residential, specifically designed for young people in school years 7-11, organised and delivered by a dedicated team of experienced DBS checked youth leaders from across the Diocese of Chester. It's a time for young people to gather with others who share similar beliefs and outlook on life, and to engage with Christianity in a way which may be new to them.



#### **Setting God's People Free**

Setting God's People Free is a national initiative by the Church of England to encourage whole-life discipleship, so that members of our congregations are better equipped to live out their Christian calling Monday to Saturday as well as Sunday. It is about helping people to live intentionally as Christians in the workplace, the home and the neighbourhood. Over the next few months, the team which is co-ordinating Setting God's People Free in the Diocese is looking to work with around ten pilot parishes, of different sizes, contexts and church traditions. The aim of the pilot will be to assess how well congregations feel they are currently equipped in this area, and how confident they feel about it, and to trial different approaches and resources with them. The learning from the pilot exercise will then feed into a major launch of Setting God's People free in the diocese early in 2019. # How does God answer prayer in a scientific world? - 1 May 2018

Or might the world of quantum theory and chaos open up a new kind of thinking about how God works? Led by The Revd Professor David Wilkinson (St John's College, University of Durham).



## **Enabling churches course - 3 May 2018**
