Headway is a two year programme of seminars and conversations exploring the art of leadership. It is for clergy and other licensed ministers who would like to form a learning community, reflecting together on their own practice of leadership. The group will meet at Foxhill House once a month for two years, beginning in February 2019.

We will engage with contemporary thinking and writing on leadership, exploring ways in which our ministry might be, among other things, "post-heroic", collaborative, resilient, and self-aware. Headway offers a safe space for us to reflect theologically on different aspects of our leadership, before applying these to our own contexts and roles.

Headway is facilitated by David Herbert (Continuing Ministerial Development Adviser), Helen Scarisbrick (Vicar of Gee Cross) and Jenny Bridgman (Associate Vicar of Timperley and Assistant DDO).


