
Welcome to Worship


James 2: 1-4


This is a parable that Jesus told about a Shepherd and his sheep. I wonder if you have heard this story before?

It is found in the New Testament in the book of Luke 15: 1-7




There was once a shepherd who had 100 sheep. Each sheep was different.

Different personalities, different colour wool, old, young, rams and ewes.



The Shepherd knew each of the sheep and they knew him. **Each sheep was precious to him.**

They recognised his voice and followed him to places of safety and rest and to find food and water.



At the end of a long day, the shepherd began to count his sheep. 96 ... 97 ... 98 ... 99 ... ?

He quickly realised one was missing!

Knowing that the other 99 sheep were safe in their pen, he set off to find and rescue his precious lost sheep.




The Shepherd searched high and low for his sheep. Where could it be? Realising the sheep must be in danger, he began to call out for him. Suddenly he heard a faint bleating sound. The shepherd ran towards the noise and found his missing sheep tangled in a bramble bush. Using his crook, he pulled the sheep out of the brambles.



His missing sheep was safe and out of danger!

The Shepherd carried his lost, scared and tired sheep back to the safety of the sheep pen.



All the sheep were precious to the shepherd, but at times, some of his sheep needed more care and protection than others.

There are many people in our world who need help, rescuing or protecting just like the lost sheep in this story.


Some are in danger, some are lost, some are vulnerable, some are terrified, some are being teased, some are marginalised and some are simply ignored.


Let us pray ...

Amen






Remember ...
