To make Jesus known and to grow together in Him



Over the last 30 years, we have become firmly established as a bible-based evangelical church, functioning as a single unit with bases on the two sites.


Together, we serve the communities on the West of the Wirral peninsula: surrounded by the Rivers Mersey and Dee and the Irish Sea.

Vibrant <u>Liverpool</u> is to the east, historic <u>Chester</u> to the south and the delights of Wales to the west. <u>Barnston</u> and <u>Pensby</u>, although only a mile apart, are quite different in makeup.

What do we do?

Over recent years, we've refocused our activities to map with our Purpose, Vision and Values. Therefore, in addition to regular services (both <u>on-line</u> and physical during COVID-19), we have:

- Prayer meetings: during the week
- The main central prayer meeting: Thursday evenings
- The Hub: a weekly discipleship programme catering for both new and established Christians, equipping us for witness
- Men's Breakfast (sadly temporarily suspended by COVID-19)
- Women's breakfast (a healthier version of the Men's, suspended)
- Focus (teenagers' group)
- Little Tugs, Messy Church and Holiday Club (children)
- Victorian Christmas (from 2019, preceded by a Christmas Fair which had run for many years)
- Biennial Church family musical, alternating each year with residential weekend away
- Mother's Union: with much active participation

THE HUB

Welcome to the Hub, a discipleship programme designed to help every member of our church family to grow as a follower of Jesus. There are a range of options to help both those who want to take their first steps in the Christian faith and those who want to deepen their understanding and confidence in Jesus.

The Hub meets every Thursday during term time after the prayer meeting, from 7:45-9pm at St Michael's, and also online for the time being. This term, the courses available are:



What do we do?

Practical care, for our Church family and wider community is a crucial reflection of our mission. Our pastoral workers lead a network of dedicated helpers. We run a popular bereavement lunch and have opened our Church Buildings to the Homeless, during winter months.

• Wirral Ark Night Shelter

We have been closely involved with <u>Wirral Ark</u> for many years and we agreed that both Church Halls would make good potential facilities for an overnight shelter. Within a few weeks, over 80 volunteers had been successfully trained and were signed up to give up their evenings and nights over to making our guests welcome, providing a good evening meal and breakfast. Shelters were held during the winters of 2019 and 2020.

Caring

We provide a sympathetic and welcoming environment for all carers and former carers who give of themselves to provide a better quality of life for those they love. They meet once a month in St Michael's Church Foyer to have lunch and a varied programme of informative talks, exercise, relaxation or fun activities giving mutual support and friendship.

Bereavement

The monthly Bereavement Fellowship Lunch is held in Barnston Hall and provides a high-quality cooked meal to those who have suffered from bereavement and may be managing grief, loneliness and isolation. Despite its purpose, this is not a sad or solemn event - the discussions range over many topics and there is much laughter as the regular attenders meet up and exchange news.

Men's Breakfast

A perfect combination of cholesterol and Christian fellowship! Our <u>Men's breakfasts</u> are open to those within our congregation and those who aren't, those who practise faith and those who don't.

Each time we are joined by speakers from outside and within the church with the aim of growing men as disciples of Jesus Christ in a friendly and welcoming space.

Our buildings



Christ's Church, Barnston

<u>Barnston village</u>, mentioned in the Domesday Book, is set in farmland, close to Barnston Dales and <u>the Fox and Hounds</u>, a pub dating back to the 15th century. The church buildings and vicarage are surrounded by <u>fields</u> - the majority of immediate neighbours are cows or sheep!

Christ's Church, the original church for this parish, was built 150 years ago. A daughter church was subsequently built a mile away in Pensby in 1958. Over the last 30 years, we have become firmly established as an evangelical church, functioning as a single unit working from the two sites.

The main housing is some distance from the church. Most of the congregation of Christ's Church live in Barnston and Heswall, the more prosperous end of the parish, however, some 30% of worshippers live outside the parish.

In 2000 the parish hall was extended by building an upper storey, providing a large meeting room and several offices: one of which is used by the Parish Administrator. The hall is used by Beavers, Brownies, Cubs, Guides and Scouts and increasingly by community groups.

There are two schools in this part of the parish: <u>Barnston Primary School</u>, which began life as a church school in our current church hall. The other, <u>Heswall Primary</u>, is a short distance as the crow flies and a pleasant walk away across the fields. Pupils from both schools visit the church on a regular basis.



used vibrant centre. An attractive foyer with cafe-style tables and chairs is situated between the church and the large hall, making the whole area flexible and suitable for larger functions. In 2015 the pews were removed and the interior completely refurbished, making it fit to be a church for Pensby for the 21st century. The money for these significant projects was raised

church for Pensby for the 21st century. The money for these significant projects was raised by our congregations at both sites. All the loans are now repaid - reflecting the level of commitment to the united mission of the church.

St Michael and All Angels, Pensby

In 2006 St Michael's Church underwent a major building project. The old church hall was demolished to make way for a new hall, extending the existing building. This project, a major leap of faith, is already fulfilling the church's hopes of providing a focus for life and is a well

The buildings are surrounded by an open grassy area with flowers and trees and provide a welcoming aspect to shoppers and passers-by and a site for outdoor activities for the children. Recently, in conjunction with <u>Pensby Community Association</u>, St Michael's adopted the site for the annual community Christmas tree – providing a starring role at the heart of the community.

In contrast to the rural setting of Christ Church, St Michael's is in an urban area. Arguably the best <u>Chippy</u> on the Wirral is opposite, plus a row of shops that includes an <u>undertaker's</u> that regularly calls on the services of our clergy!

<u>Thingwall</u>, <u>Pensby</u>, <u>Ladymount Catholic</u> and <u>Stanley Special</u> primary schools are within this part of the Parish. A large secondary school, <u>Pensby High School</u>, lies nearby.

The Vicarage

Situated next door to Christ's Church, this provides a lovely home. There is a detached garage and the large rear garden borders on to open fields

PCC

We are pleased that our PCC is an active, enthusiastic and fully engaged group that reflects and represents the dynamics, gifts and diversity of the Church Family to both our Parish and the Diocese. Mission Leadership Team (MLT) Comprising clergy, CYAF worker and 5 lay people, the MLT reports to the PCC and supports PCC and clergy strategically and practically to implement our purpose, vision and values - a plumb line for all we do and plan for the future.

Safeguarding

We've adopted the national CofE procedures and guidelines. Our Safeguarding Officer, with the Clergy, have encouraged members of the Church Family to complete the CofE basic awareness and foundation courses. Six trained pastoral workers and many volunteers meet with the clergy every few weeks, to consider the pastoral needs of the church members; whether in person, by telephone, with prayer or with home communion.

Our challenges



Our challenges

Our Purpose, Vision and Values underpins what we do and informs where we want to go. We want to trust in opportunities and solutions, but sometimes get stuck by fixing our gaze on things that don't matter, rather than God's Kingdom.

With the COVID-19 pandemic, we've had to change the way we do things drastically – becoming experts in digital technology and broadcasting - <u>streaming services</u> and children's work, together with communicating and coordinating pastoral work, letters and messages by email. We've also kept our buildings open for worship in a safe environment, for those who prefer to attend physically. We gave individuals the choice of how they would worship.... as the situation returns to normal, we hope that our church family may not only recover but also grow yet further.

Even before the pandemic, only a small proportion of our community attended our services and meetings. We want to reach out more effectively as we work to make Jesus known to all our community: to people of all ages, backgrounds and beliefs.

Most of our Church family are older (sorry, more mature). We want to develop ministry and discipling for young people. Our Children, Youth and Family worker works phenomenally hard – but relatively few young people attend our services or meetings regularly. We really want to grow this.

- A Spiritual Leader: who will be guided by the Holy Spirit and help us to listen, learn and follow.
- An Evangelist: to enthuse and help us to reach out to our community and to express our faith and help us to stay focused on our mission both locally and internationally
- A Leader: able to identify, nurture and grow gifts within the Church family, expanding the work of our church from lay leadership to service
