

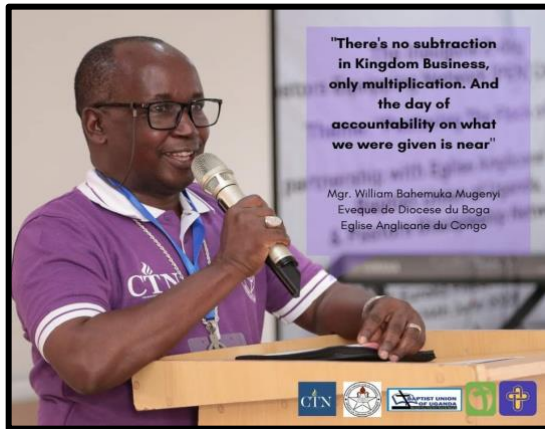
I have not communicated much for the last few weeks. The reason being that I had two main responsibilities given to me. One is that I am the General Secretary of the Anglican Mission Society. The second one is the role of the Chair of Peace, Reconciliation and Discipleship given to me by Archbishop Titre Ande Georges. Because of that, I had two major events to organize and coordinate in May and June.

As a General Secretary I had to plan and organize the College of Consultors meeting to be held at the Botanical Gardens Hotel in Entebbe, Uganda. Delegates came from the States, Canada, India, Haiti, Tanzania, Rwanda, and Congo. Filled with the Holy Spirit the atmosphere was so good, a lot has been shared to see the Mission of Christ grow. Positive resolutions have been made to embark on a new page, with love and humility. We honored the servants of God who pioneered the movement: Bishop Chuck Murphy, Bishop Fitzsimon Allison, Bishop Alex Dickson, Bishop John Rodgers. We recognized the great contribution of Archbishop Moses Tay, Archbishop John Yong. We were honored to have with us Archbishop Emmanuel Mbona Kolini. We received Rt Rev Page Brooks in the Society with enthusiasm and hope to work with him in harvest.



The second responsibility had a double duty, organize a seminar for 20 clergy from the diocese of Aru and Boga in Kampala, Uganda. But before that, I had to translate, edit, and print a book and workbook in two languages: French and Swahili. I have attached the copies of the books. The workshop was a blessing, that brought the pastors from Aru, Boga to meet their counterparts from Uganda. Next year, we are taking the ministry in the whole Province of the Anglican Church of Congo. For Aru and Boga Boga diocese the ministry aims at training 2,000 churches leaders with the manual, the methodology of training coaches, coaches who will train facilitators and facilitators who form groups of 7-12 church leaders at various levels covering the whole diocese.

We are all convinced that it would bring about revival in the Church of Christ in Congo.
