A Reflection from Bishop Mark

Come with me, if you will, to a clearing just outside the city of Jericho, roughly 3,500 years ago. Here is Joshua, chosen leader of the people of God doing as he has been instructed and leading God's people into the land God has promised. Jericho is the objective, the people have been (re)consecrated, and Joshua is preparing. He 'looked up and saw a man standing in front of him with a drawn sword in his hand', which must have been a bit of a shock. Being made of stern stuff (he is the leader of the people of the Living God, after all), he 'went up to [the man] and asked, "Are you for us or for our enemies?"' (these quotations are from Joshua 5.13-15 NIVUK).

Now, we know that this was an angel of the Lord, so we might well expect that the answer should be that God is for his people, especially as they face a major battle. However, the man replies 'Neither... but as commander of the army of the Lord I have now come.'

I don't know about you, but I find I need to stumble over this. If God is not on Joshua's side, what is Joshua doing?

Joshua, though, sees further and deeper. He falls to his face in worship and asks 'what message does my Lord have for his servant?' It is as a result of this prayer that the people of God find security in the city of Jericho, and this is vital to notice.

I come back to this interaction often in my prayers, especially at the moment. It is so easy to seek to recruit God to our cause, but true prayer is always the other way around. Even in my purest pursuit of the purposes of God, His will and way are always bigger, better, holier, and greater. Praying does many things and the pray-er never leaves unchanged

This week General Synod meets. We will be discussing many different matters (including several that might well be quite challenging). Pray with me that we might be kept in step with not only the will of God, but the way of God. That we might be held, led, formed, and holy in all that we do. Pray for those who struggle, and those who speak. Pray that the voice of Christ might be clear and that all who are broken might find life. Pray that the Lord Himself might be among us...

... and let's include all that we are in those prayers. Wherever we might be and whatever we might be doing in this week, God's plan, purpose, way, and life is always bigger than we have yet seen.
