Increasing our Missional Reach

One day an expert in religious law stood up to test Jesus by asking him this question: "Teacher, what should I do to inherit eternal life?". Jesus replied, "What does the law of Moses say? How do you read it?". The man answered, "'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, all your strength, and all your mind.' And, 'Love your neighbour as yourself.'"

"Right!" Jesus told him. "Do this and you will live!"

The man wanted to justify his actions, so he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbour?". Jesus replied with a story: "A Jewish man was traveling from Jerusalem down to Jericho..."

Luke 10:25-30 (NLT)

The world has changed. Our culture used to be centred on place; where we lived, its physical environment, and the relationships with neighbours. Now, much of life is centred around purpose; the things we do, the places those activities occur, and the friendship networks we build. However, many of our faith-based activities are still place-oriented. We've settled with those we feel comfortable with, who share our world view; there are so many people we no longer connect with in any meaningful way. Who is our neighbour now?

Jesus' challenge to the religious expert was to think far more expansively about who his neighbour really was. Mind-blowing inclusivity of the truly "other". The foreigner, the irreligious, the culturally different.

Today, we are praying that our eyes might be opened to this reality. That Jesus' call to true neighbourly love and hospitality is two-fold: being open to bless the stranger as we welcome them into our world, and blessing the stranger by being willing to enter into their world.

We are all, each and every one of us, wonderfully made.

Young or old, weak or strong, rich or poor, fearful or faith-filled, lost or found.

Open our eyes to see the ones we have not yet blessed, welcomed, or loved.

Turn our hearts so we may we be able to

be blessed and be a blessing,

be welcomed and be a welcome,

be receivers and givers of your love,

We are all, each and every one of us, wonderfully made.

Thank you, Creator God, who loves each one.

Planting Missional Communities

I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow. So, neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow. The one who plants and the one who waters have one purpose, and they will each be rewarded according to their own labour. For we are fellow workers in God's service; you are God's field, God's building.1 Corinthians 3:6-9 (NIVUK)

The bible is full of agricultural metaphors, stories and parables; God is truly a gardener at heart; whether creating in the tranquillity of Eden, or moving purposefully towards peaceful flourishing in the "Garden City" described in Revelation. He seems constantly excited about the possibilities of harvest; if only we would join in the work and scatter some seeds that He can grow and make fruitful!

Today we pray that we might become better seed scatters, irrigators and workers in the field; that we can begin to imagine new ways to help people hear the gospel, encounter Jesus, and grow into faith-filled disciples.

Give us courage to scatter the seeds of your good news, and to trust that you will grow it.*

*Lord, you encouraged us that some plant, some water, some reap the harvest;
Give us courage to find our place somewhere in the field, and a willingness to work with you in the task.*

*Lord, you encouraged us that the fields are white unto harvest;
Give us courage to hear you call to be part of your workforce, and confidence that you will bring people to faith in Christ*

Developing our Missional Leadership

So, Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ. Ephesians 4:11-13 (NIVUK)

The Apostle Paul makes a strong case for leaders; not to “Lord it over people”, but as an outworking of Jesus’ model of servant leadership. If we are to be equipped for service, be built up into the body of Christ, understand Jesus better, or become mature in our faith, we need good leaders with a range of gifts and skills. But their work is to be other focused – to help us grow, mature, attain the whole measure of the fullness of Christ. Today we pray for our leaders. We give thanks for those leaders we already have, for the strategic work we are doing to encourage, equip and release more leaders, and for the future leaders God is already calling.
