St Bartholomew

Unless you have a Holiday Club, this could be one of the quietest weeks in the summer at church: the children are off school, so no assemblies. Some may be on holiday, others may be hosting families on visits.

A quiet week is a good week for remembering the Saint and Apostle whose Festival is on Tuesday: Bartholomew. Bartholomew, or Nathaniel? By either name he was a friend of Philip, and that is one of the very few things we know about him. Like Philip he may have come from Galilee, and initially he was prejudiced against anything from Nazareth!

But Jesus had a place for him, and Bartholomew immediately recognised the Kingship of Christ and threw aside his prejudice.

We don't know what role he played in that small company: he wasn't one of the trio who were taken to witness the Transfiguration, nor was he the keeper of the purse. Was he just one of the "helpers", one of those with no title, no place in the hierarchy, just someone who looked after people, loved them? Always there, being useful? He was a friend; he worshipped the Son of God in humility; he travelled and preached the Gospel as he went.

We don't know much about him; and nor do we know much about those who have encountered Jesus during the pandemic, and crept into worship, unrecognisable behind their masks, or those who served secretly. In the quiet may we start to know them more clearly and love them more dearly as together we follow Christ more nearly.

Foundations for Ministry

Over 1180 individuals have successfully completed the Foundations for Ministry (FfM) course since its inception. FfM's unique blend of vocational discernment alongside theological study aims to help people examine what God is calling them to do.

Many people use the course as a step towards authorised ministry within the Church – and over 300 currently serving ministers, lay and ordained – began with FfM. Others

have used the course to advance their sense of vocation in many other walks of life. Having a developed sense of God's calling in occupational, family or voluntary roles is often a real encouragement.

Many on the course choose to follow the assessed pathway which leads to a Church Universities Certificate in Ministry (CUCM), validated by the University of Chester. The modules of the CUCM are part of the subsequent awards used in both Pastoral Worker and Reader training. Having failed to find space on the bookshelves for a recent purchase, I decided it was perhaps time for a pruning session. But as often happens during a decluttering exercise it was inevitable that several items seemed worthy of another browse. I began leafing through one book in particular, bought several years ago after hearing an especially inspiring sermon by its author. In *Genius, Grief and Grace: A Doctor looks at Suffering and Success*, Gaius Davies has selected eleven people he describes as 'heroic figures' to study from his perspective as psychiatrist and Christian. Each of his subjects is defined as being in some way gifted to the point of genius, none of them exempt from suffering, either through life experience or illness, but all blessed with divine grace. In each biographical sketch he attempts to discover the impact of these factors on their lives of faith and how adversity may lead to achievement. He reflects, too, on the question of

how temperament and faith are connected and the relation between personality and the way God's grace works in the heart.

His subjects include Luther and Bunyan, Frances Ridley Havergal, Amy Carmichael, J.B. Phillips. Davies acknowledges that there has had to be some conjecture on his part. For example, we cannot know if William Cowper was inspired to write his hymn *Sometimes a light surprises...* in a period of calm or anguish, though the beauty of the words and the hope contained within them may well suggest the former.

There is much encouragement to be taken from these sketches and as John Stott reminds the reader in his foreword, the message in the end is Christ's word to Paul: "My grace is sufficient for you, my power is made perfect in weakness." 2 Cor.12:9.
