What can be achieved in 2023?

What does 2023 hold for you, your school and your community? The start of a new year presents the opportunity to look ahead to all that is to come over the next 12 months. A chance to define the hopes and aspirations for the people we care for, including the children and young people who attend our schools. A time to set goals and targets for the next twelve months. As Christians, we may consider what God is calling us to do, the places He is leading us to, and where we should be focussing our time and energy in this new year.

A consideration for all of us in 2023, is how we are actively caring for our environment, seeking to look after God's creation and reducing the damage caused through our carbon footprint. The Church of England made an ambitious pledge at General Synod in 2020 to reach net zero by 2030, with schools a part of this pledge. The DBE is to make this a focus for our work in 2023, aiming to work alongside our schools and pupils, looking at the fabric of our school buildings and energy use, to pledge to reduce our carbon use and each play our part in our responsibilities to protect our planet.

The DBE will be setting its own goals and targets for schools around this and we are keen to hear from schools that are interested in taking a lead and being directly involved in this important work. The article on page 2 shares one way in which your school can get involved through the energy improvement grant, announced recently by the DfE. However daunting and challenging these targets may seem, when we come together, we can achieve so much more. Throughout the Bible, God's people accomplish unfathomable tasks. God is most glorified by bringing an event to pass which seems impossible. "With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible," [Matthew 19:26] Let's see what we can achieve together in 2023.

Moving towards Net Carbon Zero

As you may know Chester diocese has a link with the Anglican Church of Melanesia and we are in the process of refreshing links between schools in this diocese with schools in Melanesia. One of the areas that will be an important part of the link is the understanding of children and young people in this diocese about the environmental impact of global warming, felt first hand by the people of Melanesia and how what we do here, impacts directly there. The islands of Melanesia are at risk of rising sea levels with coastal communities in danger of disappearing and we have a desire and duty to support them. You can find out more about what the church is doing through the <u>Green Apostles Program</u> in this area of the world or you might explore <u>Christian Aid's 'Letters for Creation'</u>. There is also a series of webinars from the Church of England on "**Getting Net Carbon Zero**" including information for schools, here <u>GNCZ Webinars</u>. As individual schools, you could begin to consider the changes that can be made to your daily actions in order to support the Carbon Zero aim.

One way would be to consider how you use your share of the £500 million funding announced by the DfE for schools across the country to spend on energy improvement measures.

This funding has been made available as an additional allocation of DFC for all schools. Chester DBE has now received the allocation for VA schools as the responsible body. We are seeking your interest in joining with other North-West schools to make the most of the money on offer:

In partnership with DBE Services who serve hundreds of schools across the region, we wish to bring as many schools together as possible to make the most efficient use of these funds. Our proposition is that DBE Services procure the delivery of:

- LED lighting,
- Photovoltaic Panels (PV Solar Panels),
- Electric Vehicle (EV) Chargers
- and Cavity Wall Insulation

so that we can bring best practice and best value for every VA school involved.

We understand that schools are under significant pressure financially and we believe these measures will help to ease the burden. We are now finding that **every £10,000 invested could deliver around £2,000 of revenue savings**, year on year, at the current price of electricity so we believe that by joining together we can get more back for every pound spent. Of course, there are environmental benefits too which is high on the agenda of the Church of England and Chester Diocese.

There is no commitment required at this stage but if you are interested in our proposition, please return an <u>expression of interest</u> by Friday 20th January 2023.

After we have assessed the interest from schools, we will get back to you with next steps.



Diversity Resources – Anthony Walker Foundation



Since our annual Head Teacher and Senior Leaders' conference in 2021, it has been a privilege to work more closely with the Anthony Walker Foundation. The testimony and heartfelt, faith-driven conviction of Gee Walker to forgive her son's racially motivated murderers was truly humbling. Catherina Quinn, the Education Lead Officer at AWF has already led an inspiring session for our CPD programme last autumn raising awareness of developing an understanding of anti-racist practice, addressing racial equity in education and racial bias.

Continuing our support of their work, we are keen to highlight two of the Foundation's sessions which support all primary and secondary schools in progressing anti-racism:

- Celebration of Diversity Assemblies/workshops yr 1-6 Explains important concepts such as racial prejudice, discrimination and anti-racist allyship. The workshops share Anthony's story at an age appropriate level, his legacy and pupils explore how important it is to love and respect difference. AWF strongly encourages early interventions with primary age pupils that helps shape a more inclusive and caring school community where everyone is valued and respected.
- Speak Out Stop Hate workshops/assemblies yr 6-13 were set up in response to an alarming number of hate crimes going unreported. These workshops focus on racism and hate crime awareness. Pupils learn of Anthony's story, how hate incidents can quickly escalate into hate crimes and the consequences. Pupils explore why so many hate incidents go unreported and they are introduced to the AWF Hate Crime reporting tool.

Picture News – Protected Characteristics


