### **Jubilee Celebrations**

The start of this month has marked the special celebrations of Her Majesty the Queen as she became the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee. Over the extended bank holiday weekend, the nation came together through a range of special services and community events to mark and give thanks to our Queen Elizabeth who has faithfully served her country and God as monarch for the last seventy years. Our schools have held their own jubilee celebrations and it would be wonderful to receive any photos and information from these so that we can share some of these in next month's bulletin.

One of the special events to commemorate the jubilee was a service of thanksgiving at St Paul's Cathedral. The Archbishop of York, Stephen Cottrell, who spoke at our HT & Senior Leaders' Conference in 2018, led the sermon in which he said this,

"For me, the best leaders - like Paul, like Jesus - are those who know how to be led. People who lead for others, not themselves. People whose heart's desire is to serve the common good and build up the common life; who don't try to do it all themselves, or act in their own strength alone; people who take a longer view; and who seek out places of replenishing, even places where they might learn the mind of Christ. And... in Her Majesty the Queen we see an example of this kind of service; a staunch constancy and a steadfast consistency; a faithfulness to God, an obedience to a vocation that is the bedrock of her life."

Whilst this is written about the Queen, it could equally apply to the dedication and commitment of those who lead our church schools and churches. May you seek out those places of replenishment during this busy period, as we move into the final half term of the school year.

#### **Canon Chancellor Award 2022**

Canon Chancellor Award at Chester cathedral has been taking place for eight years.

This is an annual award to encourage quality of teaching and learning of Christianity in schools.

# Heads' wellbeing programme for 2022/23.

The headteacher wellbeing programme is a year-long programme to support headteacher wellbeing. Taking place in the beautiful setting of Foxhill we run two cohorts, one for experienced headteachers and one for those who are more recently appointed. There are four sessions that look at a variety of different topics and strategies as well as time to meet together and support one another. In addition to this Heads receive termly wellbeing visits that are an opportunity to discuss any matters that are prevalent at that time. Two of this year's cohort shares their thoughts below:



As an experienced headteacher I tended to work on auto pilot, but I know this can lead to 'burnout.' We don't give ourselves time to reflect on us as a person even though we are always looking out for others. The headteacher wellbeing programme gave me permission to stop and reflect on myself as well as giving me the tools to support myself and others. As a result of this course I have been able to put things in perspective and to deal with an ever-increasing workload. I have had time to read some great books that have changed my practice but more than anything, the chance to meet others and talk about the importance of looking after ourselves, so we can look after others, has been really powerful. The beautiful building, grounds and artwork in Foxhill is the perfect place to reset yourself.

This course is a must for all headteachers, I can't recommend it highly enough. I hope there will be a chance for me to join another course like this in the future.

The Headteacher Wellbeing Programme has been a huge help to me, I cannot recommend it highly enough.

It has provided me with practical strategies, an opportunity to prioritise wellbeing and has helped me to build supportive relationships with other colleagues. The chance to meet in the beautiful Foxhill House, to stop and reflect on what can be such a fast paced and reactive role has really helped me to gain a sense of perspective and has helped me to take practical steps to support both my own and my team's wellbeing.

Please take this opportunity to prioritise your wellbeing, it will pay dividends in the future. I thoroughly recommend the course to anyone in headship, in fact I wish I could repeat it again next year!

#### **Bollington St Johns**

Our school council have planted a Glastonbury Thorn tree, to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. The Glastonbury Thorn is believed to have been brought to the UK by Joseph of Arimathea, and a flowering sprig is sent to the British Monarch every Christmas.

Each half term, the whole school work together on the same book, which has been carefully chosen to support the teaching of the wider curriculum. In Spring, we explored 'The Black Book of Colours'.

This wonderful book helps a sighted person imagine what it is like to be blind. The text is both typed and in Braille and has raised black line drawings on black paper, which can be deciphered by touch. The children used this book as a stimulus

to explore poetry on colour, communication and inclusion.

We then moved on to learning about the Hindu festival of colour, Holi and end with a community celebration of colour, with a poetry recital and colour run. It was an amazing day filled with colour and love!

#### Stockport St George's

We are taking part in the celebrations to mark the 125th anniversary of St. George's Church. The children have been busy performing Psalm 23 for the members of the church as well as family and friends. The whole school took part and it was super to have such a large celebration after the restrictions of the past couple of years. The children completed art work which are now displayed in Church. Each class completed a pictorial representation of the Psalm and the banners are now hung in Church. Prayers were said for all experiencing conflict which is especially poignant as we welcome 33 refugee children next week to the school.
